### **Executive Director's Report**



- Congratulations to Andrea Newsom who has officially been promoted to Finance Director! Andrea has been with the GMRC since December 2011 and upon Becky Siever's retirement in late 2016 has been fulfilling the role as Interim Finance Director. Andrea has hit the ground running this year and has done a tremendous job in preparing the FY 2018 budget!
- We have recently signed the contract to begin work on the MAP-21 Project. Through the Georgia Association of Regional Commissions (GARC), the project is to partner with Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) and Information Technology Outreach Service (ITOS) to provide planning and GIS-based services for GDOT in compliance with mandates imposed by the Federal Surface Transportation Act, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21). Faith Bryan will be overseeing the project for the GMRC and will require data validation and/or capture of specific road characteristics identified through federal legislation.
- The Georgia Assembly successfully passed two bills relating to local governments and/or regional commissions:
  - <u>HB73 (Downtown Revitalization Tax Credit)</u>, which provides for tax credit incentives to promote the revitalization of vacant rural Georgia downtowns by encouraging investment, job creation, and economic growth in long-established business districts.
  - <u>HB 183 (Georgia Geospatial Advisory Council)</u>, which recreates the Georgia Geospatial Advisory Council under the Department of Community Affairs; to provide that all documents and data of the current Georgia Geospatial Advisory Council that is under the Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources shall be transferred to the new council under DCA.
- An accurate and complete census count is important to your community. The Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA) operation is the one and only opportunity for tribal, state, and local governments to review and comment on the Census address list, which will serve as the foundation for the 2020 Decennial Census. DCA is conducting an informational workshop on May 8, 2017 from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the GMRC office, 1310 W Ridge Road, Gainesville, GA. - Daniel Martin and I recently met with Joel Katz of Congressman Doug Collins' office and Andrew Seaver of Senator David Perdue's office to talk about many important topics affecting our local governments, including the President's Budget Blueprint. It was a great meeting and we look forward to a constant line of communication with our congressional staff and offices
- Please mark your calendar for our Annual Legislative Appreciation Dinner, which will be held on May 25, 2017 at 6:00pm at the **Dawson County** Junior High.
- Speaker David Ralston recently announced that Representative Terry Rogers has been appointed to the Georgia House Rural Development Council. This council, which was created during the recent legislative session, will work with rural communities to find ways to encourage economic growth. We look forward to working with him in this capacity.
- Congratulations to North Georgia Technical College who recently broke ground on their new Industrial Technology Center on the **Clarkesville** campus. The 45,000 square foot building will house a CNC Machine Tool Program, Air Conditioning Programs, as well as a general industry lab so that existing industry can do customized training.

• Congratulations to the following communities in the Georgia Mountains region on being awarded funding through the **Recreational Trails Program (RTP)**:


City of Lula: Nature Trails Project

- Important changes are being made to the Georgia RTP program. The program will go to a biennial (every other year) application and grant award process beginning in Fall 2017, with the grant awards to be made in 2019, and the next funding cycle announced in Fall 2019. The maximum grant award amounts will also be increased above the current \$100,000 level. A full list of program changes are expected to be released soon by DNR.
- On behalf of Lumpkin County and Habersham County, two Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) applications were submitted to the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) for expansions at each of their respective Senior Centers.

#### **Planning**

- The Towns County Joint Comprehensive Plan has been adopted by Towns County and the cities of Hiawassee and Young Harris.
- **Lumpkin County** has adopted the update to their *Comprehensive Plan*.
- The **City of Dahlonega** has adopted the update to their *Comprehensive Plan*.
- Union County has adopted the update to their Comprehensive Plan.
- **Franklin County** is amending the Land Use element of their *Comprehensive Plan*.
- The GMRC is assisting the **City of Maysville** with the design of *an amphitheater for their City Park*.



#### **Information Services**

- GMRC released a Request for Proposal for the 2018 Aerial Photography/LiDAR Project. Proposals were due April 17<sup>th</sup> with six vendors responding. - Staff met with City of Maysville to update the Official Zoning Map, Voting Wards Map, and discuss city owned cemetery.

If you would like for GMRC to process the US Census Bureau's residential address list for your jurisdiction, it is very important that you designate GMRC as your LUCA Liaison or Designated Reviewer on the registration form. Without this designation, GMRC will be unable to assist you.
